Participants explored the concept of core values, reflecting on personal beliefs that guide their decisions and aspirations. This session encouraged self-discovery and alignment of personal and career values.




Goal Setting

In an interactive workshop, participants learned techniques for effective communication, empowering them to confidently express their ideas in creative and professional contexts.




Inspiring Inclusion & Belonging


